### Maundy Thursday Foot Washing (4/6): Look for the Servant

Sometimes our attitudes close us off from experiencing love in its fullness. We can think that we are unworthy, or undeserving of love- so when it is freely offered, we turn away. In John's Gospel we hear a story about love demonstrated through acts of humility and service, and while we may be comfortable being on the giving end of such acts of devotionas Jesus prepared for his final meal with his followers, he asked they allow him to show his love to them by washing their feet. This kind of love, the kind that gives permission to be cared for, to be held, to be vulnerable, does not come easily to many of us. But if it is true, that it is better to give than to receive, then we must take the risk- allow others to see the "dirt on our soles/souls" and we must show the humility to gratefully accept the gift of loving service.
