Emerge: to new life and new possibilities

Our Eastertide series, which began on Sunday, April 16, is in full swing. Together we are celebrating the power of spiritual, emotional, and physical transformation as we learn to creatively embrace the changes God invites us to throughout our lives and our life together. This Sunday, we will visit once again with Jesus's friends Mary, Martha, and Lazarus of Bethany. In the opening of the tomb of Lazarus, in the unwrapping of his funeral clothes, the community had to face their unknowing — and perhaps disbelief — and trust that the resurrection Jesus had facilitated was real. The range of emotions was vast. As the butterfly's cozy environment cracks further open still, it is the effort of the process of emerging that makes change possible — waking up, rolling away the stone, unwrapping what will be.


